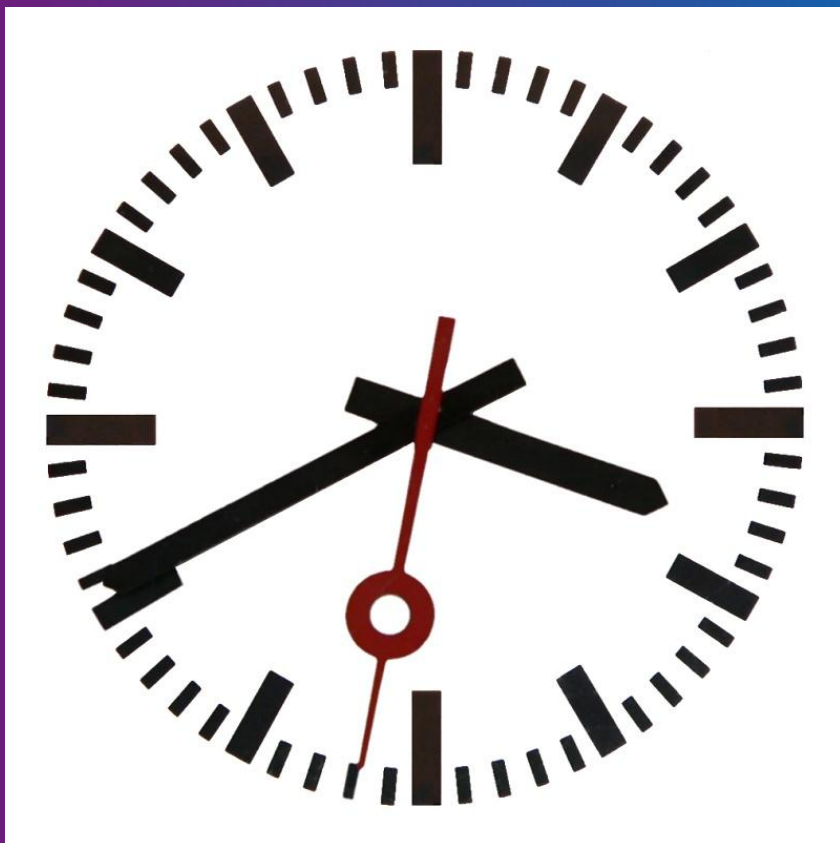

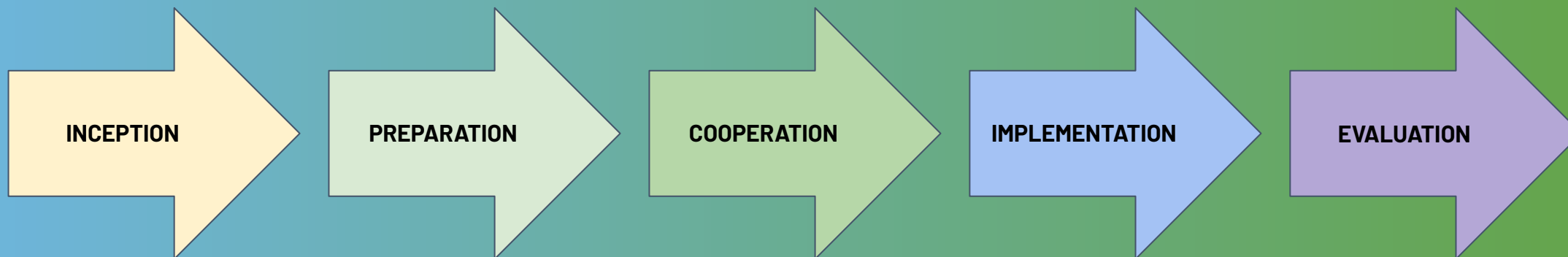
Some points to explore:

Inception session: defining the objectives

1. Create the Fellowships

- students from different social and ethnic backgrounds
- students with learning difficulties
- students with special needs
- students from all genders

2. Select a Model of Youth Participation

- criteria to select a Model

3. Motivate and mobilise the students

- a model of youth participation (MYP) that is of interest to them personally and to their school community

1. Possibly select a smaller team who will be responsible to follow and monitor

- who does what when
- deadlines to reach or redefine
- exact activities to implement
- ground rules to follow
- possible obstacles
- monitoring processes

2. Set monitoring cornerstones



[IMPLEMENTATION SESSION] Action Planning and Monitoring

Action plan implementation

Monitoring

List of the activities
Assign roles
Deadlines
Rules
Difficulties

divide responsibilities

assign weekly tasks to students

Make a checklist based on the timeline proposed

Questionnaires
Focus groups
Videos

every week meetings with students communication with the rest school community

Prepare and release regular news about the activities (important to let know what is happening to engage other stakeholders)

A teacher and a student are responsible for following and monitoring

Focus groups with students

students are responsible for monitoring the activities and report to teachers

Regular meetings with students to get (informal) feedback

Settle a plan with concrete tasks, achievable, motivating/engaging students with a specific timeline

make a list of the actions: action plan

external and internal communication

Evaluation session: assessment and rescheduling

1. Select a smaller team responsible to follow and assess the activities

2. Set evaluation criteria

3. Select evaluation tools

4. Measure the impact

5. Measure the adaptability of the Model

- propose possible changes or corrective actions
- impact on individuals,
- on the school community
- on the larger local community
- adapt the Model to new contexts
- cooperate with different groups
- measure the results and effects of this new implementation and adaptation
- developed our horizontal skills? (i.e. Problem Solving, Creative Thinking, Teamwork, Decision-making, Intra-personal skills, Inter-Personal Skills, Communication Skills, Leadership Skills)

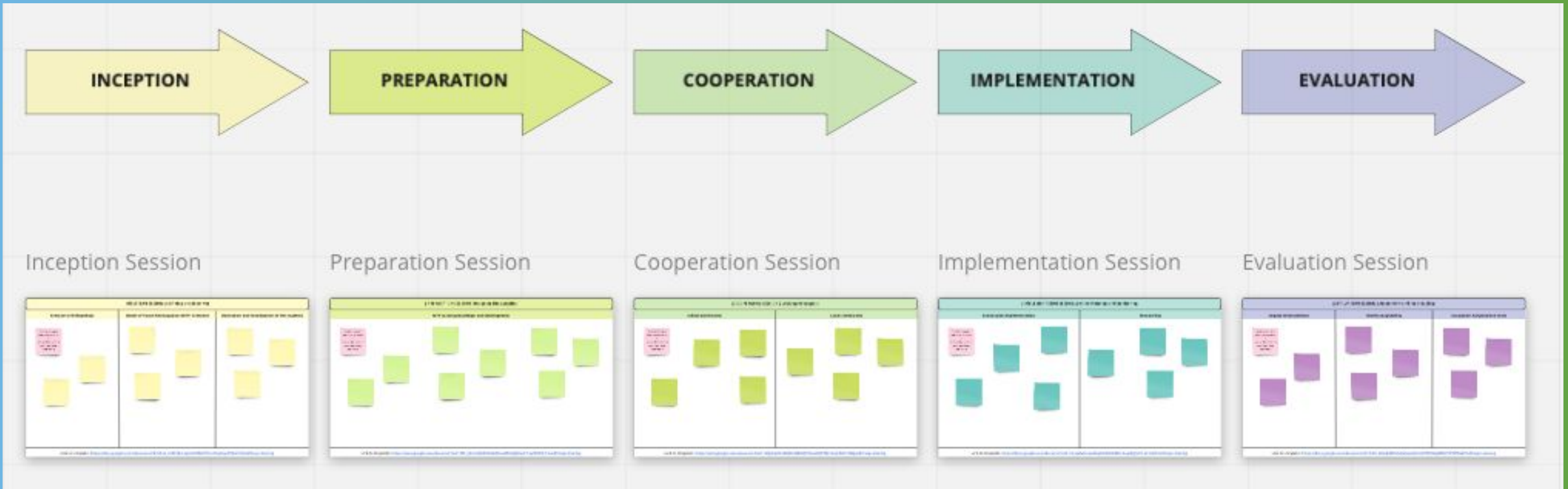

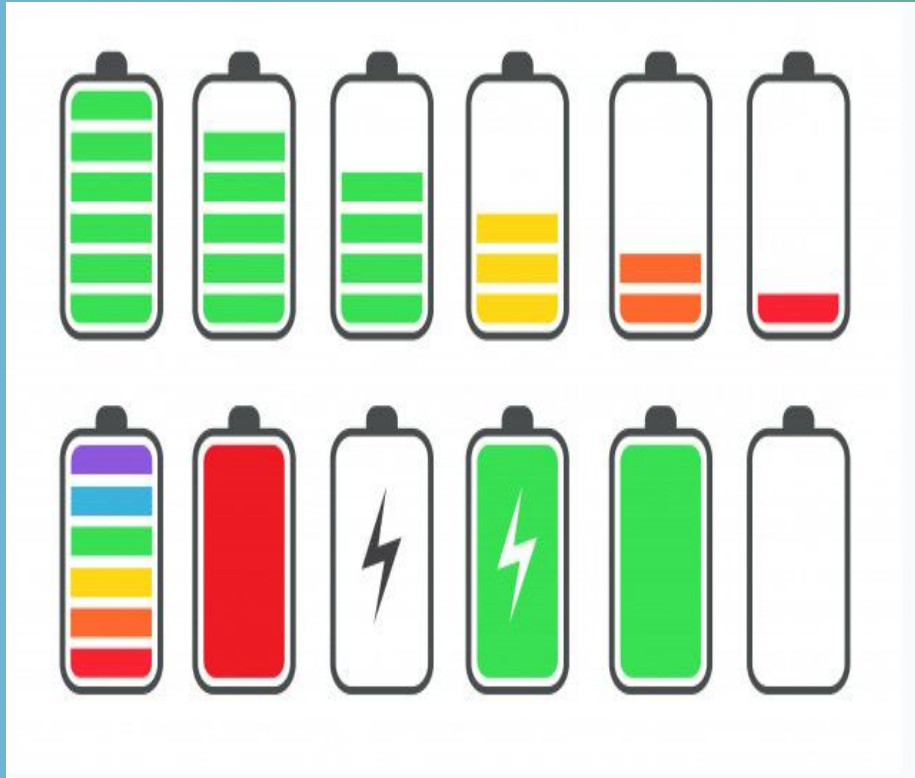

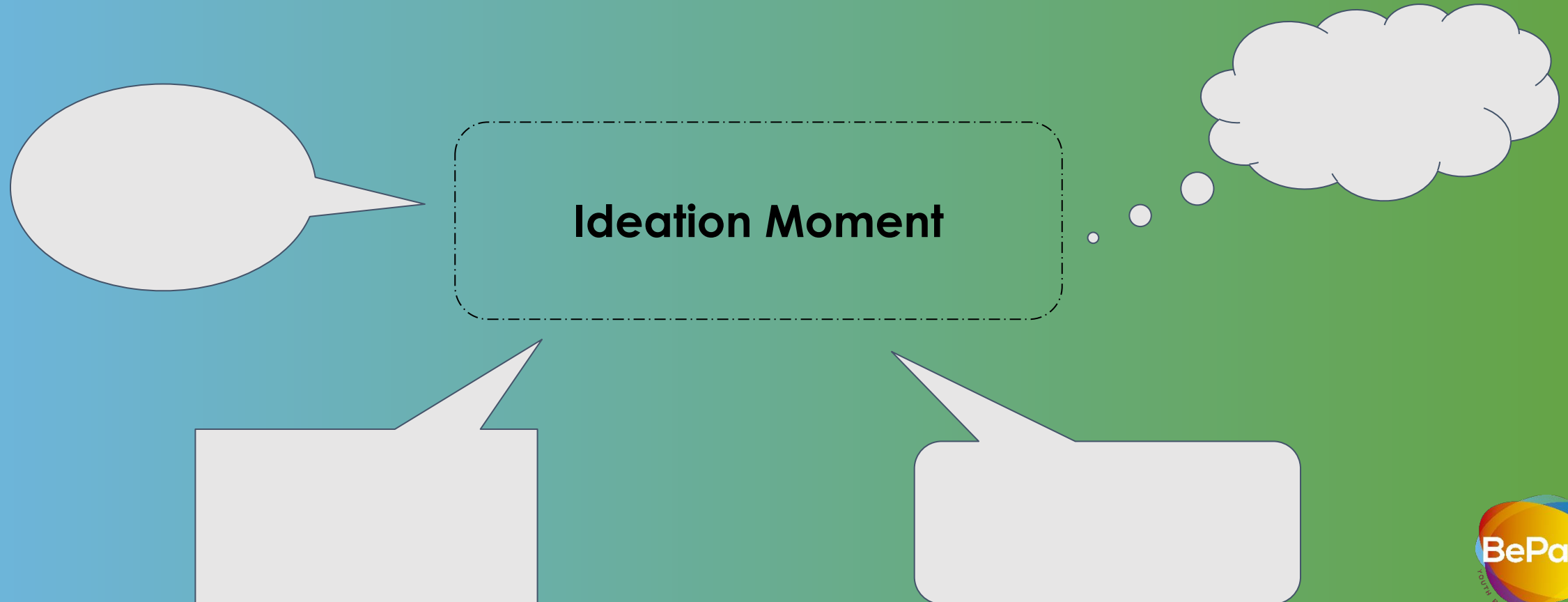
